## YOUTH IN DEMOCRACY

The **21st Century Fund** partnered with the Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation and Bard College to launch *Youth in Democracy*. The goal of YID was to encourage students to engage with local government to develop and implement a passion project that would both benefit local communities and teach students about the inner workings of local government.

Daniel Moran worked with the Town of Canaan and the North Canaan Fire Department to implement a drone program that will assist firefighters and rescue team members in assessing building safety, locating local water sources in remote areas and aiding in search and rescue missions.

Alex Wilbur worked with the Town of Salisbury and Salisbury-Sharon Transfer Station to implement a pill bottle collection program that would put our empty pill bottles into the hands of people in rural areas to safely transport much-needed medications from clinics to their homes.

Both students were invited to the CT State Senate to receive commendations from Senator Stephen Harding in recognition of their hard work and dedication to involvement in their communities.

## HOUSY SHACK: GIVES STUDENTS PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

Thanks to the **21st Century Fund**, the Housy Shack has become more than just a school store—it's a student-run business where learning meets real-world experience. Students in Julie Browning's Transitions Class and Heather Strid's Work Study Program are taking on roles that teach them how to be responsible and professional, which in turn gives them more confidence. This program embodies the mission of the **21st Century Fund** as it more than a store—it's a stepping stone to independence. As the students told us:

"We love working at the school store because it gives us job skills, we get to work with customers and sell them cookies and other things. We get real world experience working in the store and the students get experience of shopping in the store. We do the ordering, budget, stocking, baking, cleaning, and bookkeeping for the store.
